Basic Characteristics



- Part of expanded support for students, institutions, states
- Housed on NC-SARA website
- Voluntary participation, no additional institutional fees
- Programs searchable by discipline, degree level, etc.
- Search results prompt early hand-off to institutions
- Institutions certify state approval
- Up-to-date information required
- Coordination with states
- Potential coordination with *Credential Engine*; possible support from Lumina Foundation

Rationale



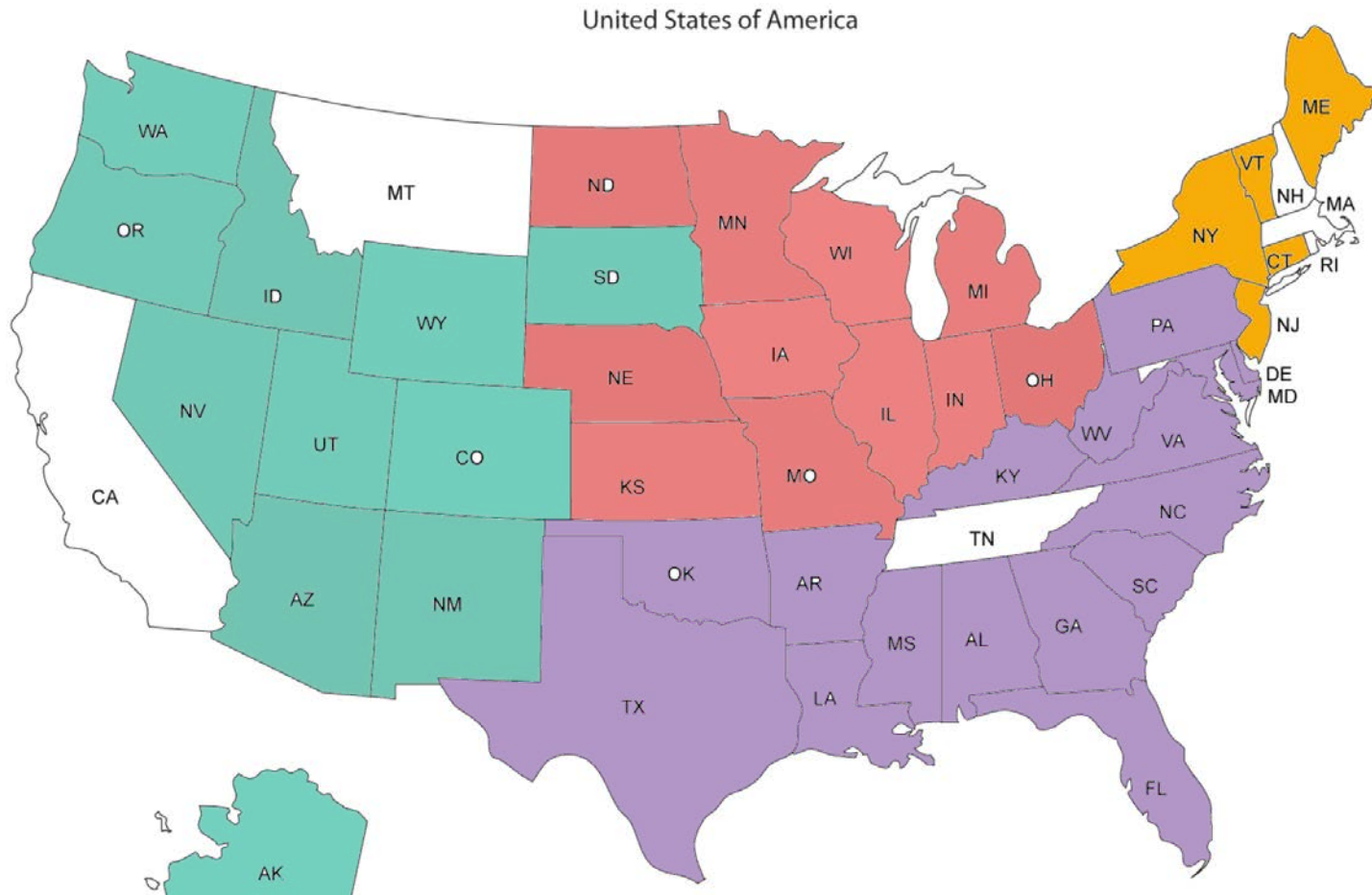
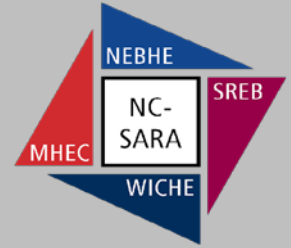
- No such database exists
- Listed programs would be offered by institutions that have met SARA requirements regarding accreditation, *C-RAC Guidelines*, financial stability, state authorization of distance education
- Can develop, implement and maintain within current financial resources
- If approved, operating by early 2019

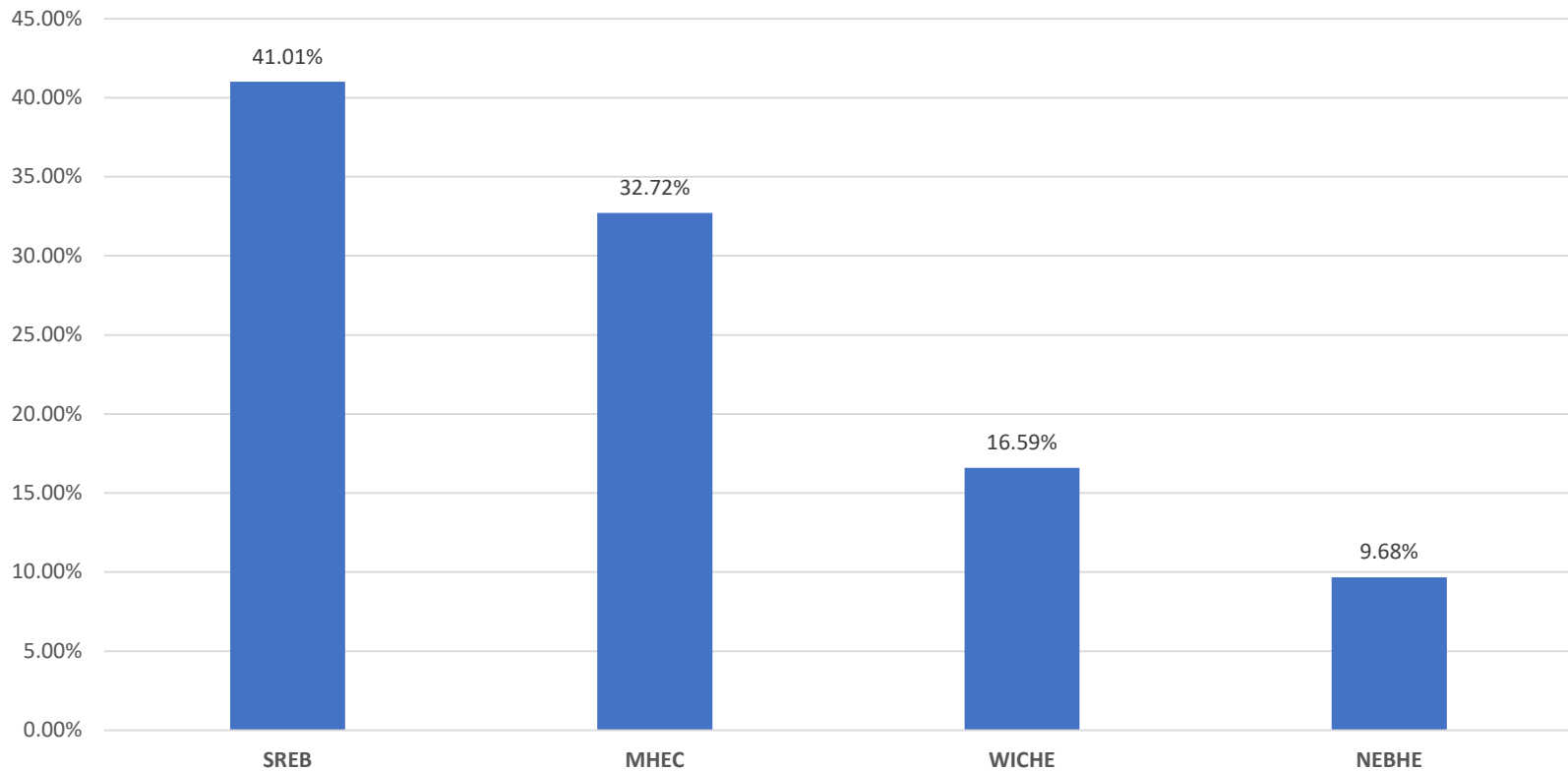
States Responding

Percentage by Regional Participation

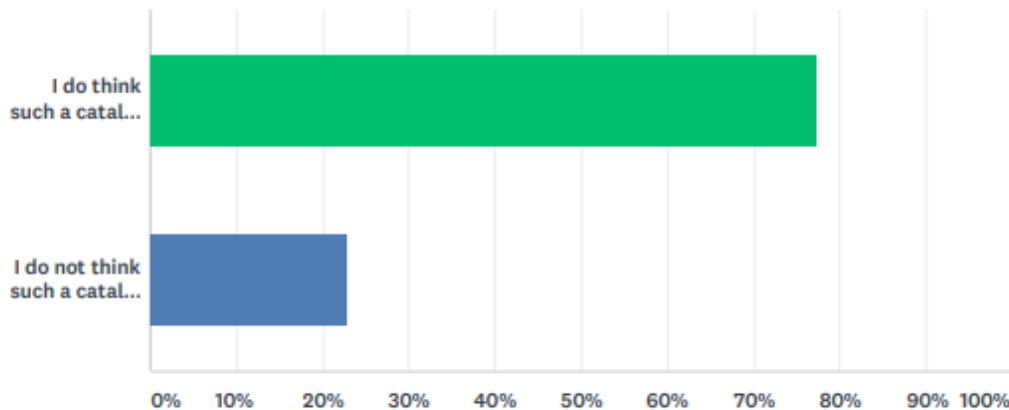


Survey Question 1: I do/do not think that such a catalog would benefit students



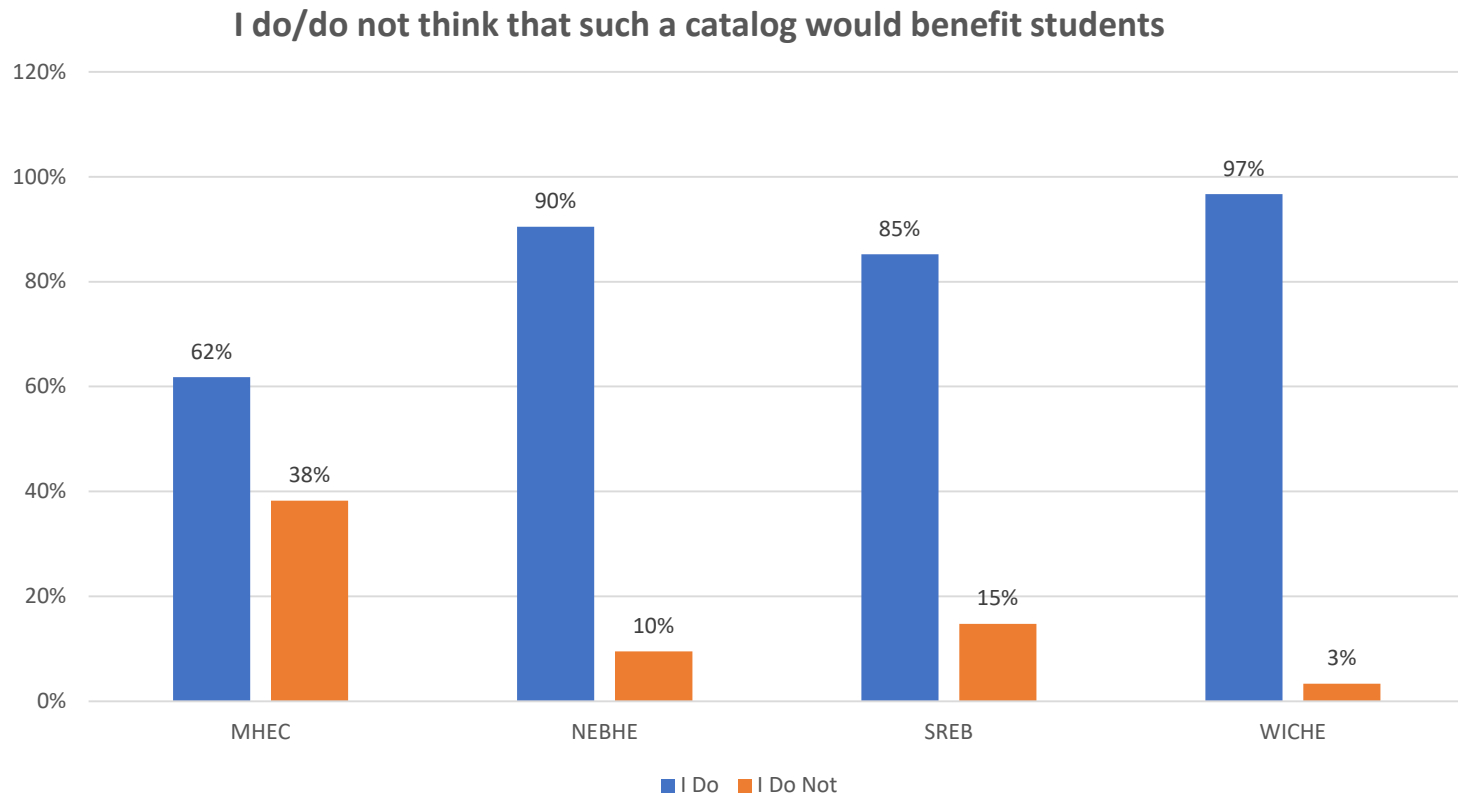
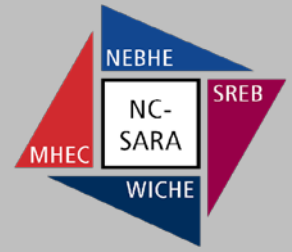

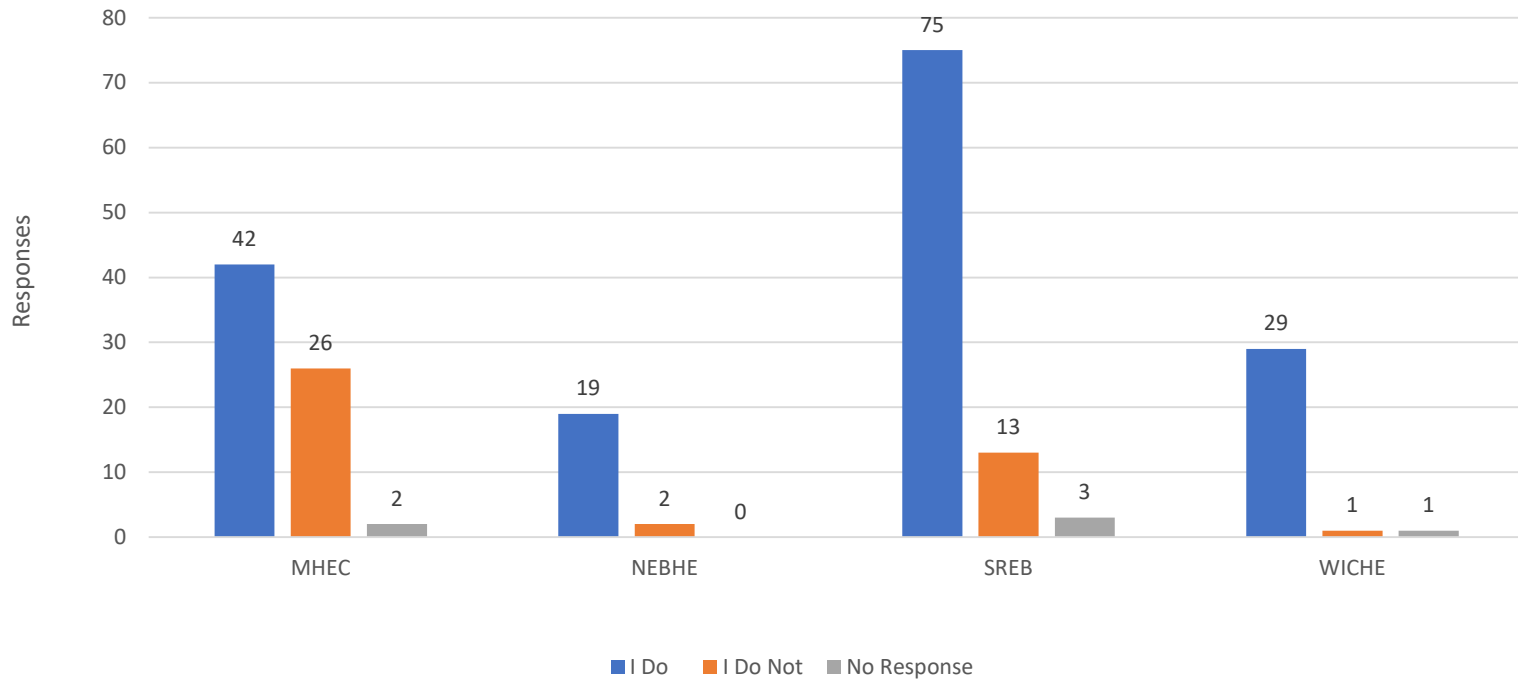
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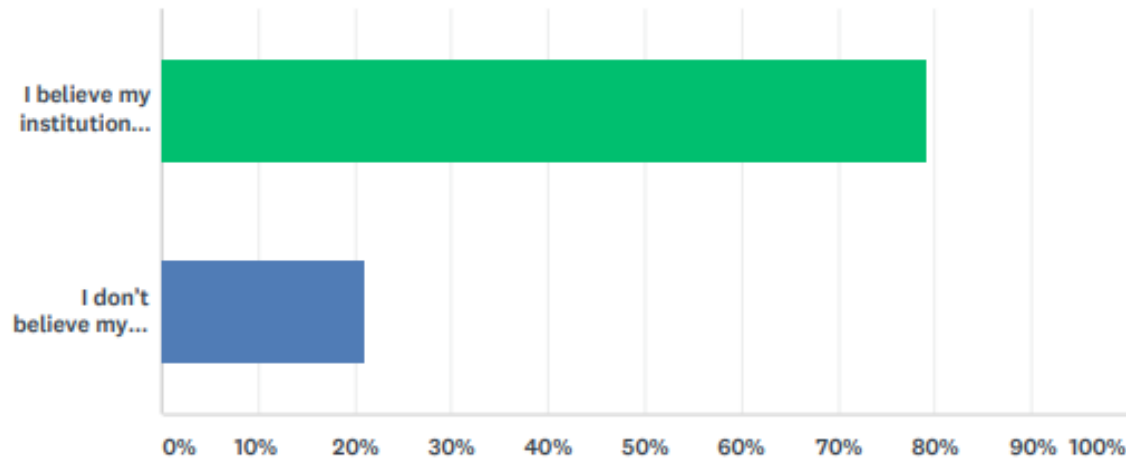


Survey Question 2: I do/do not think my institution would seriously consider contributing to such a catalog



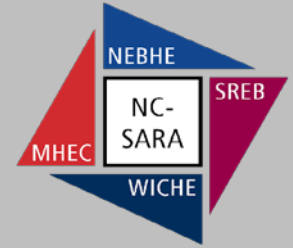
Q2 Institutions

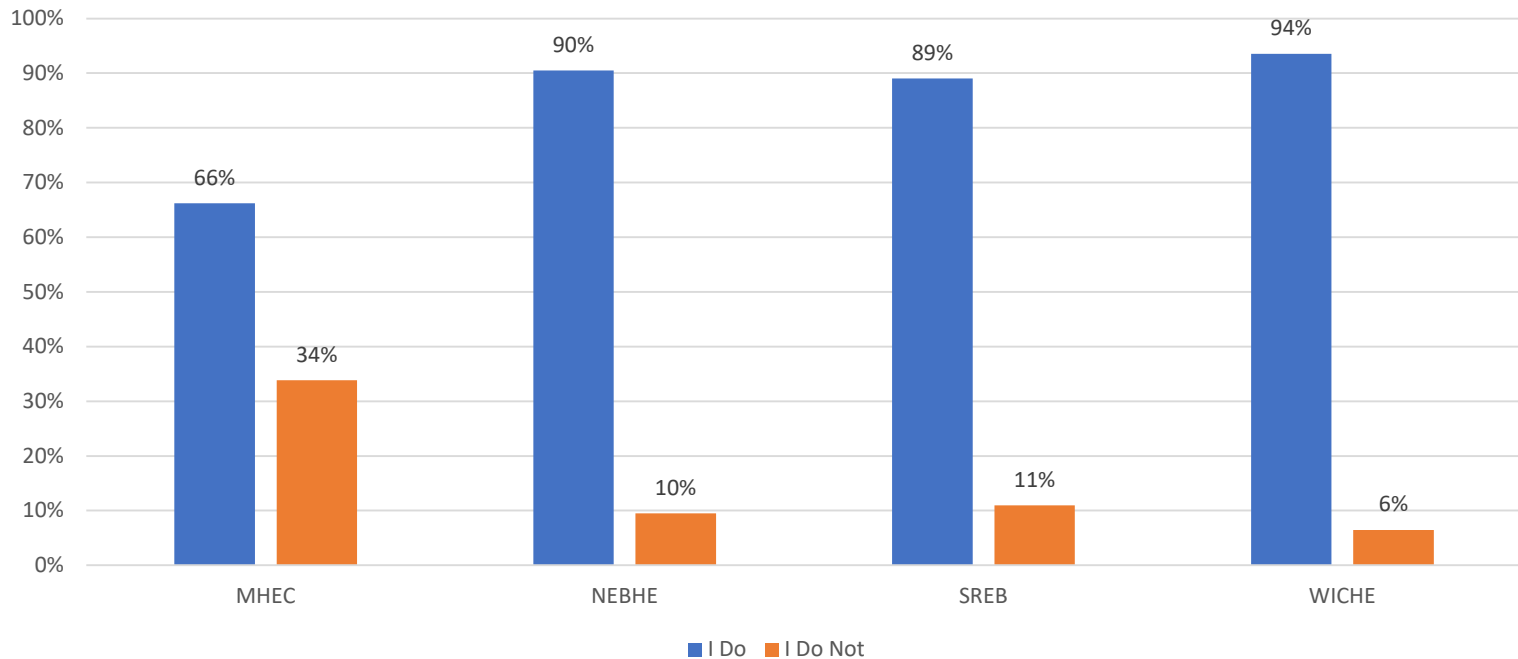

Survey Question 2: I do/do not think my institution would seriously consider contributing to such a catalog



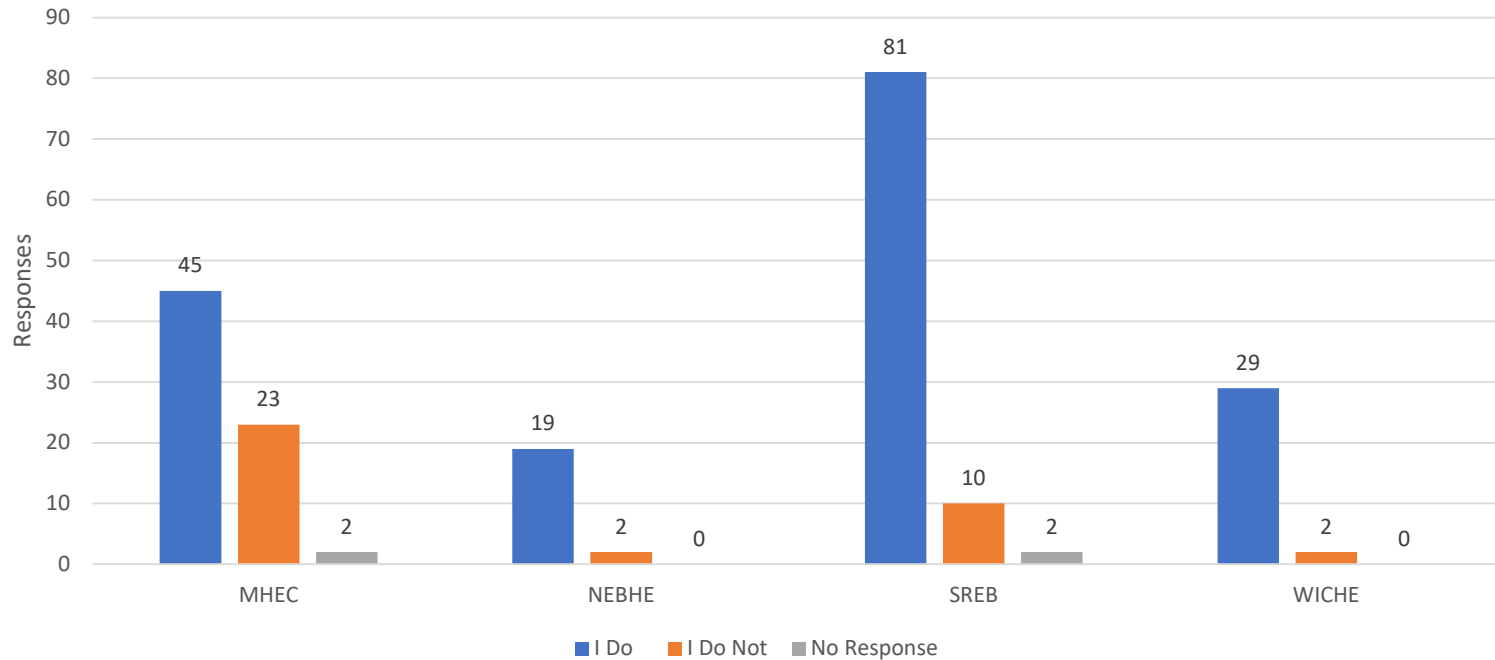
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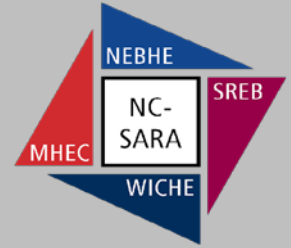


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Summary of Comments

– Three Themes



- Great idea, positive step, helpful tool
 - Useful resource for students and institutions
 - Incentive for institutional participation in SARA
- Suggestions (if catalog is created)
 - Streamline the process for institutions
 - Think about including other information
- Opposition
 - Not needed, other search engines exist (Google, etc.), institutions have web pages
 - Students wouldn't use it
 - Mission creep for SARA
 - Do other things (and/or reduce institutional fees) instead

Staff Recommendation



- Create and maintain a searchable database of academic programs available through distance education and offered by SARA institutions that voluntarily choose to list such programs in the database;
- Publicize the availability of the database;
- Include funding for related work in annual NC-SARA operating budgets; and
- Collect, maintain, analyze data and periodically report to the Board on utilization of the database.
